We should all have the opportunities to discover and live our life's purpose - full of joy, health, safety. Shocking statistics show this isn't the case for some in our community. We see an increase in mental health issues, trauma and stress that trigger unhealthy decisions and loss of hope. As a community leader and active member of the FDLA Women's Fund Board of Directors, I can report that domestic violence is a serious problem here.

I also believe we must triple down on our ongoing efforts to better address declining mental health and substance use.

Why must we connect on these issues?

Families Are Hurting

- Domestic violence continues to be the leading cause of all violent crime
- FY 2018 2021 saw an average of 340 domestic violence arrests per year (up 4% from FY 2014 2017)

Individuals Are Suffering

- Deaths by suicide are 51% higher here than the state average
- Unserved adults with mental illness are 21% greater than the state average
- Unserved children with mental illness are 19% higher than the State average
- 29 people died here in 2020 from drug overdoses (25 suspected by opioids)

Professionals Are Overwhelmed

- Access to mental health providers is 700:1 here (Wisconsin is 470:1)
- ER visits for opioid overdoses are 34% higher here than the state average
